


## INTRODUCTION

The 1995 Travel Report covers information on travel in and out of Dominica for the last ten years. This report presents data on visitor port of entry, airlines and sea vessels activities, countries of residence, length and place of stay, purpose of visit and cruise arrivals. The aim of these annual reports is to assist interested persons, establishments, firms or institutions in readily recognizing visitor/tourist trends in Dominica. These reports will help in easily identifying chief, potential and untapped markets and also provide information on the flow, activity and market share of main aircrafts and sea vessels.

Periodically, relevant information will be added and slight changes will be made in the contents of these reports. Therefore, all suggestions from users which can assist us in being more efficient will be welcomed.

The Central Statistical Office is grateful for the co-operation it has received from the Immigration Department, the Canefield and Melville Hall Airports, the National Tourist Board and the various cruise and airline agencies.

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## EXPLANATORY NOTES

### THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS HAVE BEEN USED IN THIS REPORT

- TOURISM:** Tourism denotes the temporary, short movements of people to destinations outside the places where they normally live and work, for other than business or vocational reasons and their activities during the stay at these destinations.
- Tourism represents various types of short-term travel and visits and is variously defined for particular purposes, by reference to the purpose of the journey, its duration and other criteria.
- VISITORS:** A visitor is a non-resident person (national or alien) usually resident abroad, who enters Dominica and intends to stay for not more than one year for non-immigrant purposes such as touring, recreation, leisure, business, study or family reasons. Visitors have been divided into the following categories:
- (i) **TOURIST:** Any person who stays at least one night but not more than 365 nights in land accommodations.
  - (ii) **EXCURSIONIST:** Any person who does not stay for any one night in any land accommodations.
- Hence, an excursionist may either be a flight passenger who departs from Dominica on the same day he arrives, or a boat passenger who sleeps on board the vessel in a port of Dominica.
- RESIDENT:** Any person (national or alien) who has been residing or has been given permission to reside for more than one year and who has not yet been abroad for more than one year.

TOURISTS ARE SUB-DIVIDED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Holiday visitors whose purpose of visit is expressly stated as vacation. These visitors are classified either as staying in hotels, guesthouses or cottages, or as staying in private homes (i.e. with friends or relatives).
2. Business visitors who come for private as well as governmental business purposes. Included also are research workers from international institutions such the U.N., the I.M.F. and the CARICOM Secretariat.
3. Students who are permitted to enter to pursue a course of study at a school or university.
4. Other visitors, that is, visitors not covered by the previous three categories.

THE COUNTRY GROUPINGS USED IN THE TABLES ARE DEFINED AS FOLLOWS:

O.E.C.S.:	Antigua, Dominica, Grenada, Montserrat, St. Kitts/Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent
OTHER CARICOM:	Barbados, Belize, Guyana, Jamaica and Trinidad & Tobago
FRENCH WEST INDIES:	Martinique, Guadeloupe, The Saints, St. Martin and St. Bartholomew
SCANDINAVIA:	Norway, Sweden, Denmark with dependencies, Finland and Iceland

## TRAVEL REVIEW 1995

A 5.4% increase was recorded in all visitor arrivals for 1995. The Caribbean continues to be the leading market, contributing 57.8% of arrivals and increasing by 7.7% over the last year. The United States contributed 16.2% of arrivals, reflecting a 14.6% rise over the last year. The European market however, recorded a drop of 4.1%.

The percentage of visitors using LIAT (the leading air carrier) has been declining since 1993 (Table 3). This is mainly due to the addition of other airlines on the same route. The American Eagle which began operations in November 1995 has already transported 1.3% of air arrivals. Express Des Iles (formerly Caribbean Express), a sea vessel making several trips to and from the neighboring islands, has been increasing its market share since 1993 (Table 3). Express Des Iles captured 67.2% of sea visitors in 1991 when the vessel began operations and presently its market share has moved up to 81.6%.

Over the ten year period, 1985-1995 (Table 8), the fastest growing markets were France, French West Indies and the United Kingdom. Moderate growth was observed for Other Europe, United States and O.E.C.S. markets. Other Caricom and Canada recorded the slowest growth (Table 4).

Over the last twelve quarters, the third quarter had been the most popular while the second quarter recorded the lowest number of visitors (Table 4a). This trend however slightly changed in 1995 with the fourth quarter registering the lowest number of arrivals. Unlike former years, the 1995 quarterly movement in visitor arrivals from Europe and the United States reflected a steadily declining trend (Table 4A). These movements contributed to the total decrease in European arrivals over the last year. However, for the United States market, in spite of the steady quarterly decline, total number of visitors surpassed that of the last year, registering a 15.0% increase.

Since 1990, the month of July has been the most popular for all visitors (Table 7A). For the last eight years (1988 - 1995) the month of September has been recording the lowest number of visitors. This is striking as the same quarter, the third quarter (since 1990), has experienced highs (July) and lows (September) over the years.

Tourist arrivals increased by 7.0% over the year. The 8-14 and 14-21 days stay reflected percentage increases over the period (Table 11). The 1-3 and 4-7 days intended length of stay have been accounting for 50.0% to 57.0% of all stayovers/tourists. When actual length of stay is analysed, these two categories (1-3 and 4-7 days) account for a higher percentage, 55.0% to 62.0% of stayovers. A steady increase in the over 22 days (actual) stay has been noted since 1993 (Table 18A).

Hotels has been accomodating about one quarter of all tourists (Table 13A). Forty-eight percent of tourists (a number almost equal to that of the previos year) stayed at paid accomodations while 49.0%, comparable to the last year went to private homes. Over the last five years the highest percentage of tourists in paid accomodations for each year, was registered in the second quarter.

Total excursionists decreased by just about 5.0% over the last year, registering a higher number of daytours/trippers than expected. It had not been an unusual year as in 1991 and 1992 total numbers had fallen by 12.8% in both years.

The 5.0% fall was attributed to a 32.0% drop in the European market. A 68.6% increase from France, was countered by decreases of 48.3% from Germany, 50.2% from Switzerland, and a 44.7% decline from the United Kingdom.

The French West Indies recorded a 13.9% increase. The highest number of excursionist was recorded in 1991. The total number for 1995 is still 6.0% below this record (Table 20).

Total passenger arrivals increased by 4.2% over the year in spite of a 2.4% fall in sea arrivals. Air passengers rose by 7.7%. Total cruise calls and passengers increased by 9.4% and 7.5% respectively. Over the last four years, the first quarter has been the most popular period in calls and passengers (except for 1993 when fourth quarter passengers exceeded that of the first quarter).

CHART 1: VISITOR ARRIVALS BY COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE 1991 - 1995

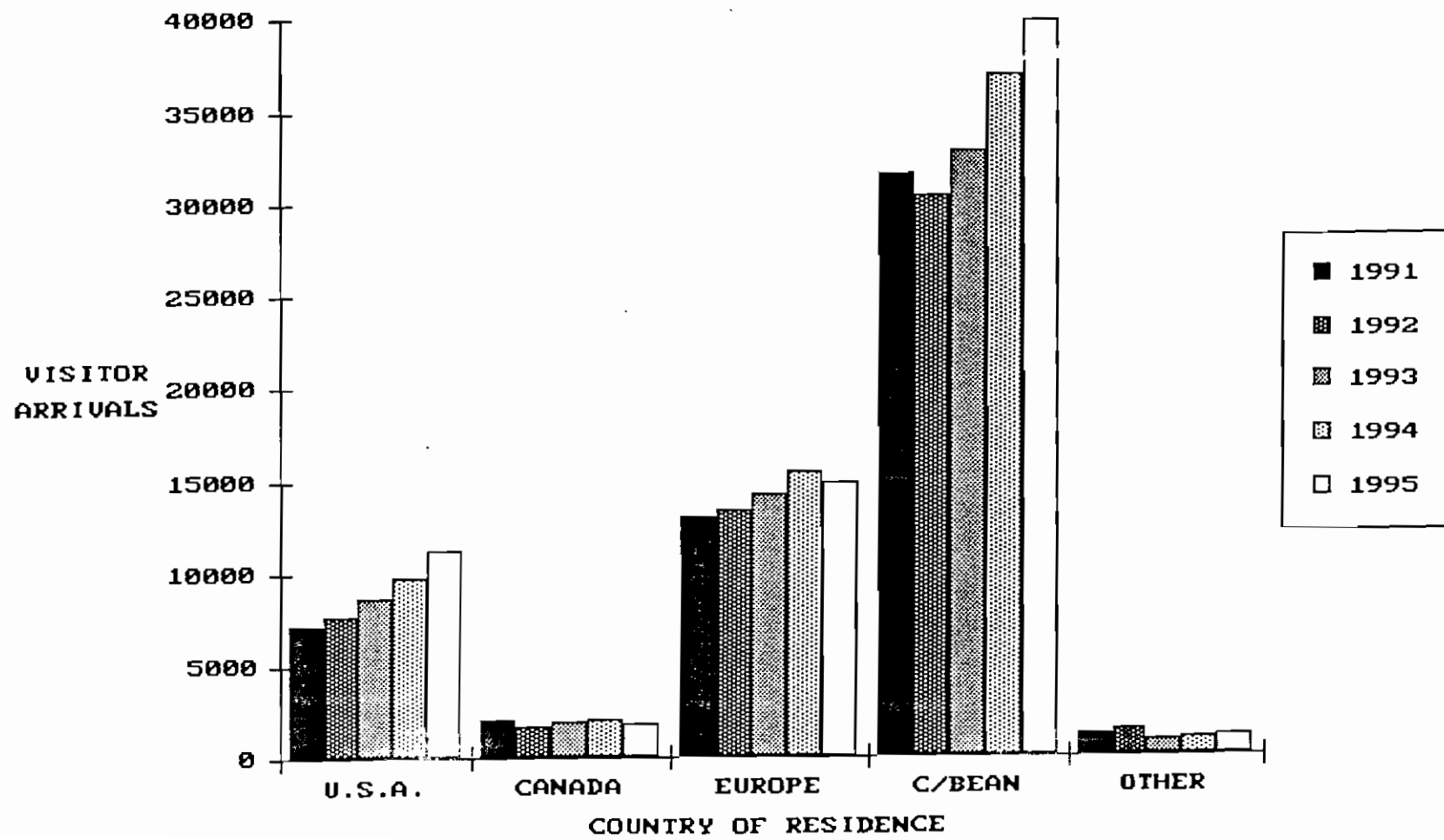


CHART 2: VISITOR ARRIVALS BY COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE 1991 - 1995

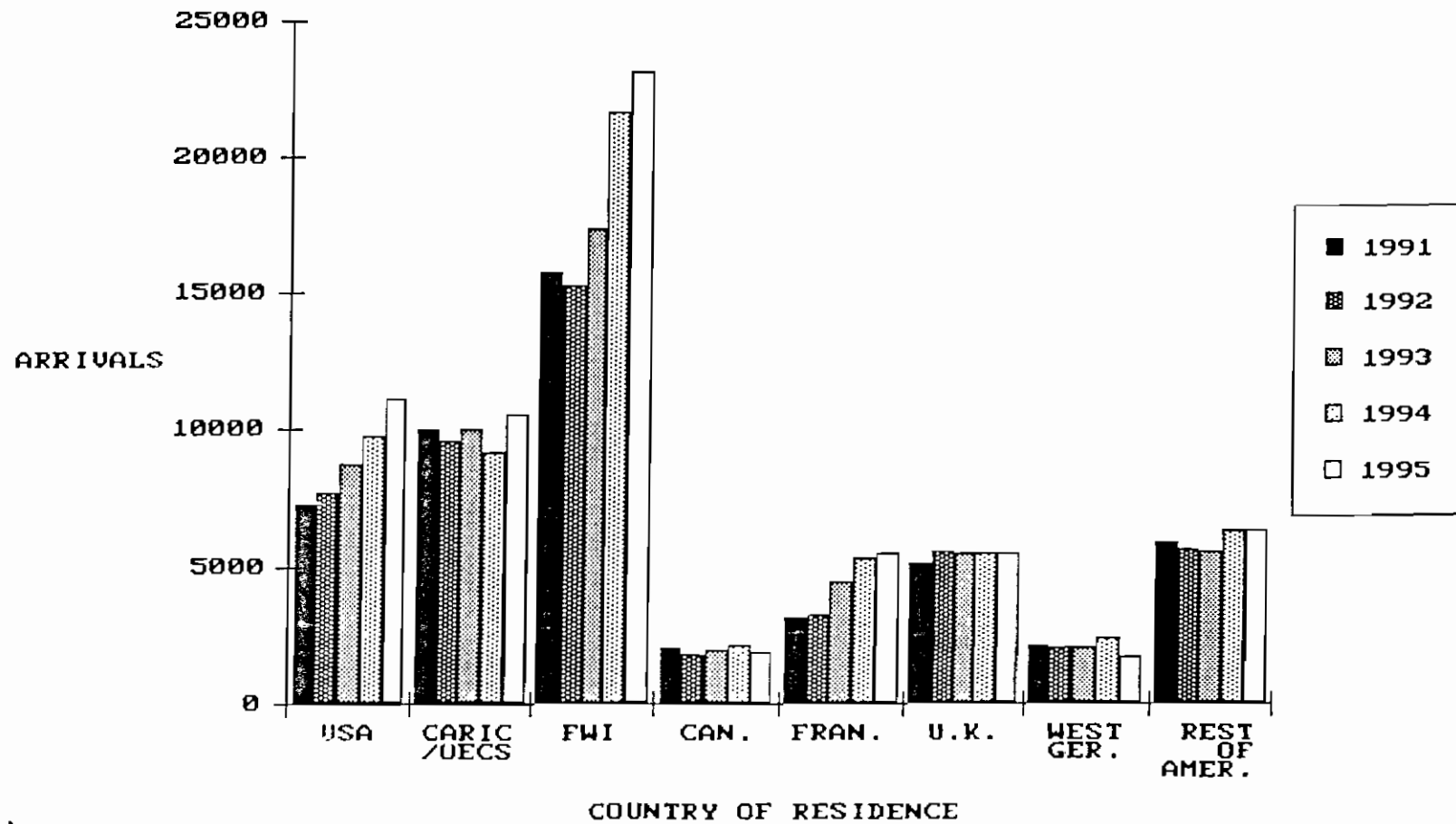


CHART 3: PERCENTAGE OF TOURIST ARRIVALS BY PLACE OF STAY 1990 - 1995

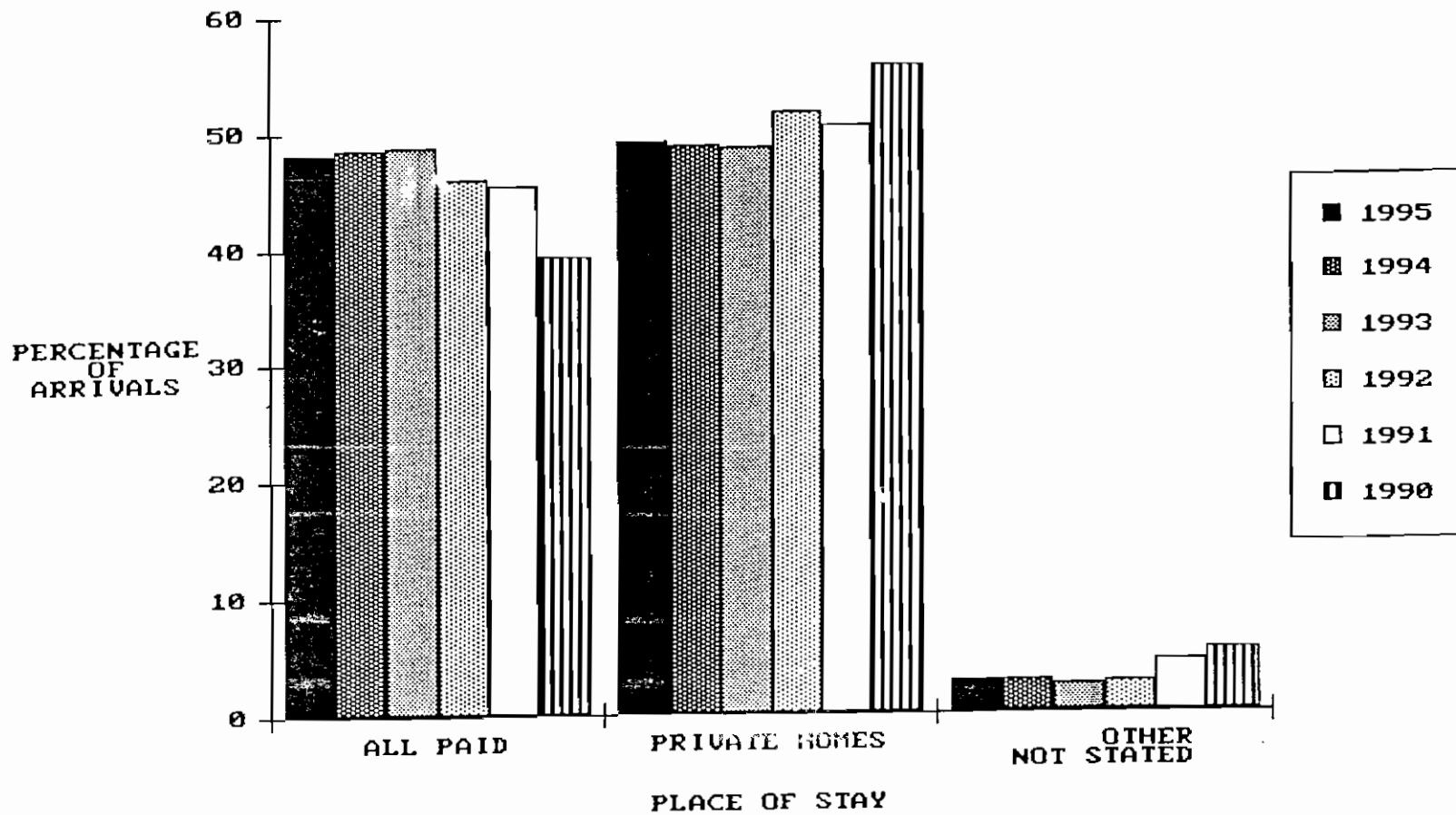


CHART 4: NUMBER OF EXCURSIONISTS BY COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE 1991 - 1995

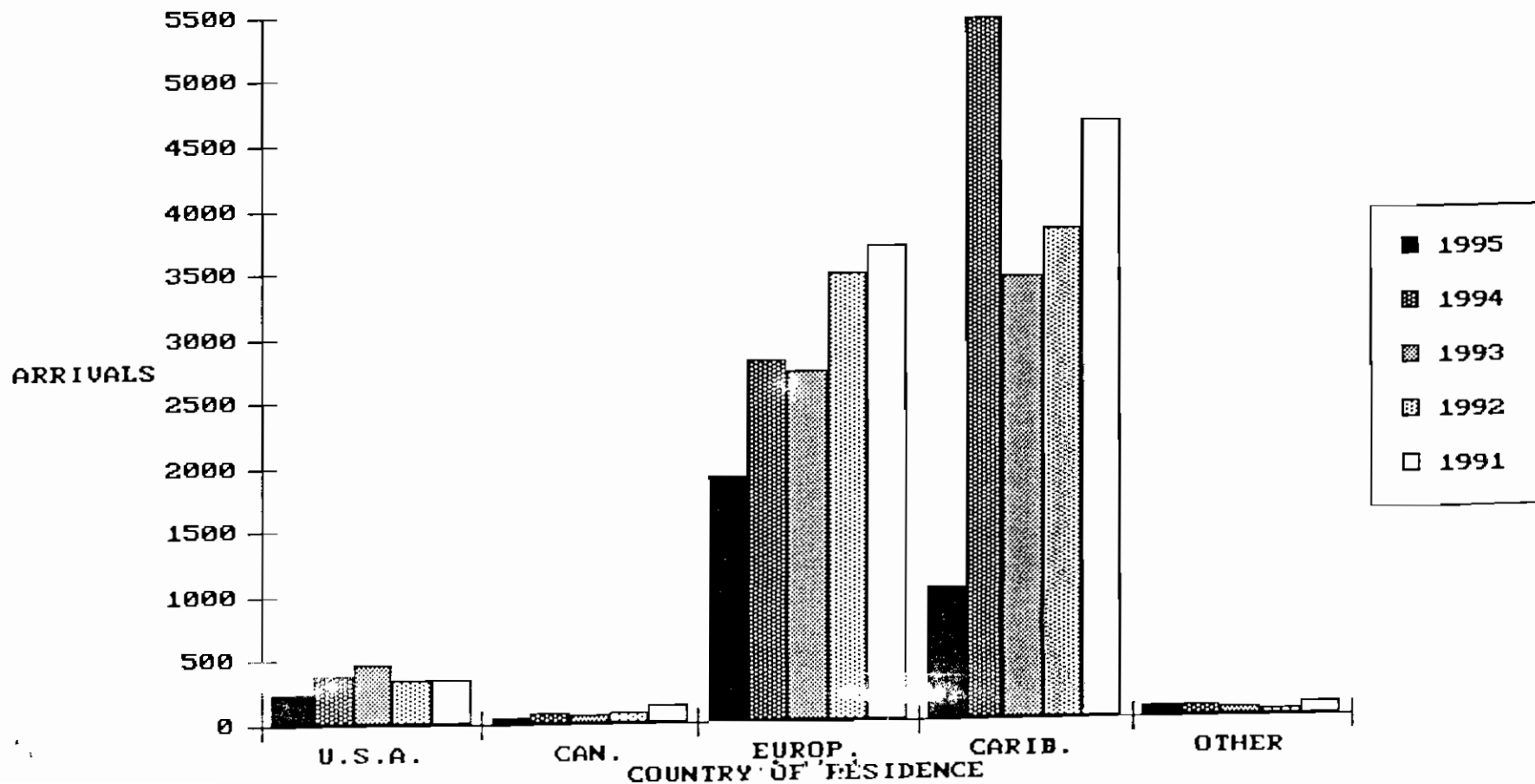


CHART 5: CRUISESHIP CALLS (EXCLUDING WINDJAMMERS) 1990 - 1995

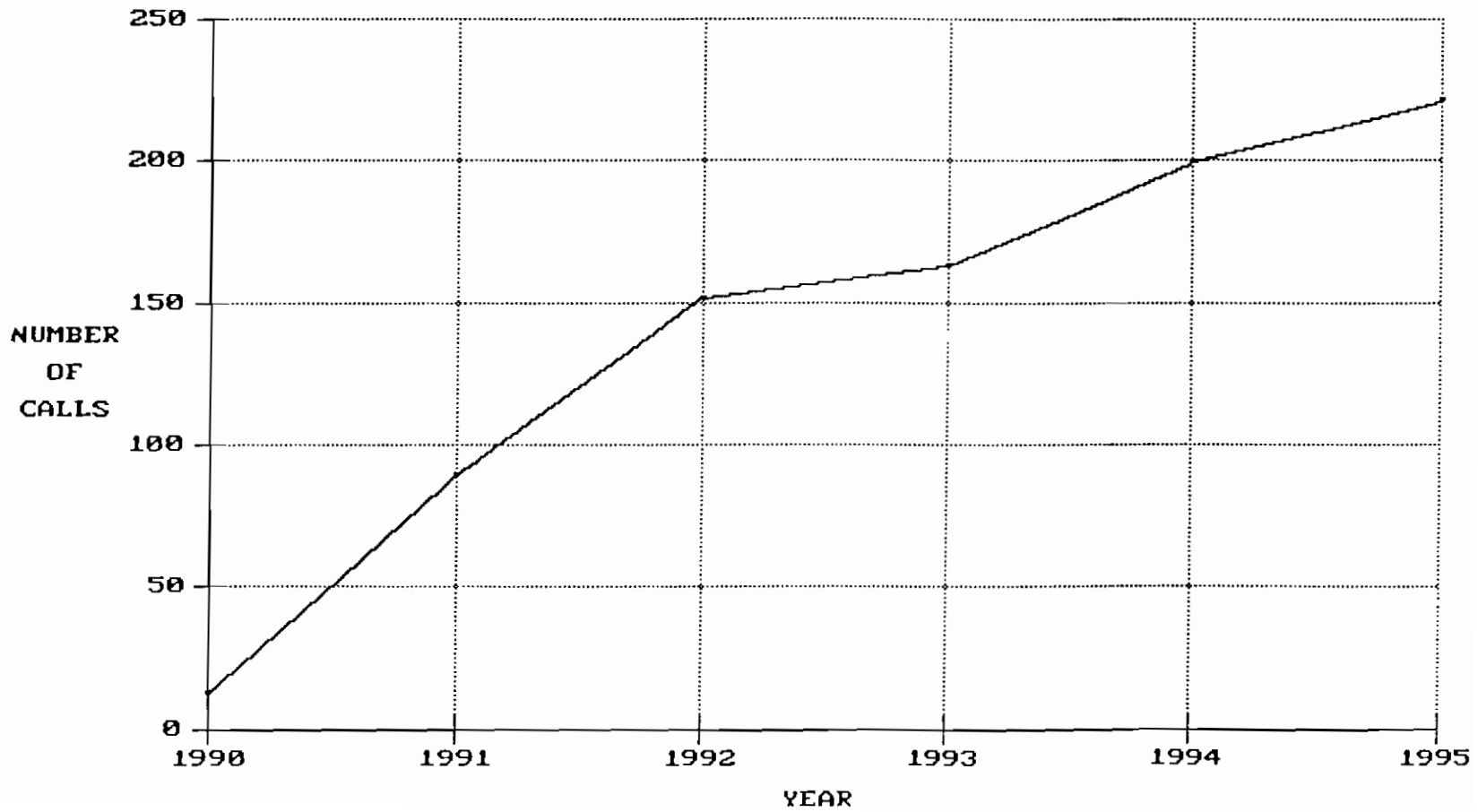
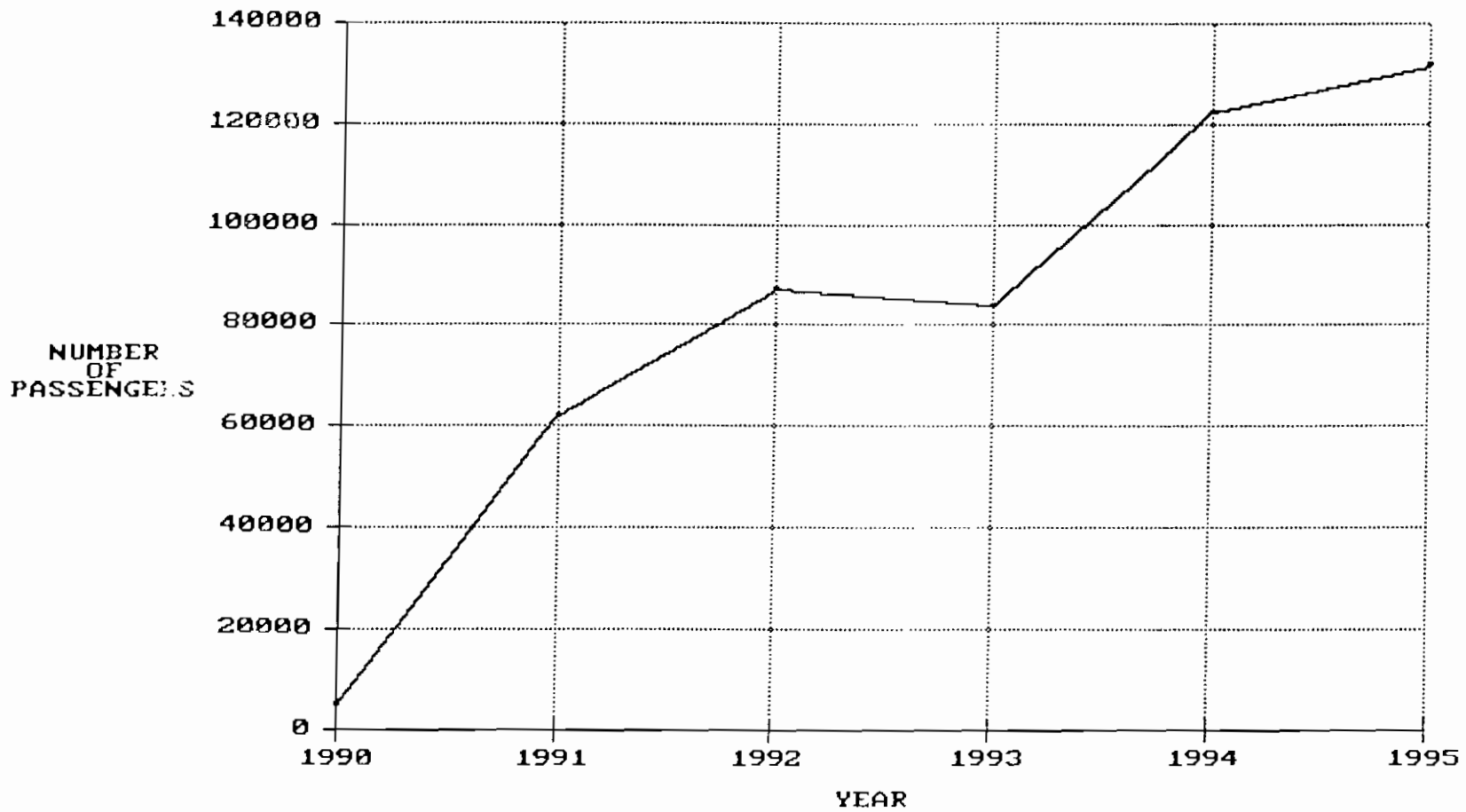



CHART 6: ARRIVALS BY CRUISESHIP (EXCLUDING WINDJAMMERS)
