






## INTRODUCTION

The **1996 Travel Report** covers information on travel in and out of Dominica for the last ten year. This report represents data on visitor port of entry, airlines and sea vessels activities, countries of residence, length and place of stay, purpose of visit and cruise arrivals. The aim of this **annual** report is to assist interested persons, establishments, firms or institutions in readily recognizing visitor/tourist trends in Dominica. This report will help in easily identifying chief, potential and untapped markets and also provide information on the flow, activity and market share of main aircrafts and sea vessels.

Periodically, relevant information will be added and slight changes will be made in the contents of these reports. Therefore, all suggestions from users which can assist us in being more efficient will be welcomed.

The Central Statistical Office is grateful for the co-operation it has received from the Immigration Department, the Canefield and Melville Hall Airports, the National Tourist Board and the various cruise and airline agencies.

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### EXPLANATORY NOTES

#### THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS HAVE BEEN USED IN THIS REPORT

TOURISM: Tourism denotes the temporary, short movements of people to destinations outside the places where they normally live and work, for other than business or vocational reasons and their activities during the stay at these destinations.

Tourism represents various types of short-term travel and visits and is variously defined for particular purposes, by reference to the purpose of the journey, its duration and other criteria.

VISITORS: A visitor is a non-resident person (national or alien) usually resident abroad, who enters Dominica and intends to stay for not more than one year for non-immigrant purposes such as touring, recreation, leisure, business, study or family reasons. Visitors have been divided into the following categories:

- (i) TOURIST: Any person who stays at least one night but not more than 365 nights in land accommodations.
- (ii) EXCURSIONIST: Any person who does not stay for any one night in any land accommodations.

Hence, an excursionist may either be a flight passenger who departs from Dominica on the same day he arrives, or a boat passenger who sleeps on board the vessel in a port of Dominica.

RESIDENT: Any person (national or alien) who has been residing or has been given permission to reside for more than one year and who has not yet been abroad for more than one year.

TOURISTS ARE SUB-DIVIDED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Holiday visitors whose purpose of visit is expressly stated as vacation. These visitors are classified either as staying in hotels, guesthouses or cottages, or as staying in private homes (i.e. with friends or relatives).
2. Business visitors who come for private as well as governmental business purposes. Included also are research workers from international institutions such the U.N., the I.M.F. and the CARICOM Secretariat.
3. Students who are permitted to enter to pursue a course of study at a school or university.
4. Other visitors, that is, visitors not covered by the previous three categories.

## 1996 TRAVEL REVIEW

Total stayover visitors recorded a 4.61 per cent increase over the year. However, a slight decrease of 0.3 per cent was registered in total visitors. This decrease was attributed to the sharp fall of 35.6 per cent in excursionists over the year.

The Caribbean market recorded the highest percentage of visitors, 55.8, for the year. Europe regained its position, as the second major market, from the United States. The United States also recorded a lower percentage of visitors in comparison to the previous year. The Canadian market remained stable (Table 1).

The Canefield airport continues to be the main port of entry, accounting for 39.5 per cent of visitors, the lowest in the last seven years (Table 2). The Melville Hall Airport to the north, however, has sharply increased its activity, recording, 28.9 per cent of visitors. This increase is primarily due to the operations of the American Eagle. The Roseau cruise-ship berth has replaced the Woodbridge Bay as the main seaport. Sea travel has been steadily increasing over the years. However, the current drop, 11.4 per cent in sea visitors was influenced by the decline in excursionists for 1996.

LIAT, an Antigua-based airline, although experiencing sharp falls in its market-share since 1995 continues to be the leading airline accounting for 50.8 per cent of visitors for the year.

The American Eagle has captured a position as the second leading airline, starting off with a 1.3 per cent of visitors in the last quarter of 1995 (the start of operations) to a 26.8 per cent for 1996 (Table 3). This performance cannot be matched to any airline over the years. The American Eagle's growth may be attributed to its established niche, the Puerto Rican route.

Cardinal Airlines and Winair began operations in 1994. Winair captured a greater market share. However, since Winair closed operations in 1995, Cardinal Airlines' growth for 1996 doubled that of the previous year, even surpassing Air Guadeloupe, a once second leading airline. Air Guadeloupe's market share reached a record low in 1996, accounting for just 4.2 per cent of air visitors (Table 3).

The previous year, 1995, has registered the highest number of operating airlines while the current year recorded the lowest. From 1992 to 1996, five new airlines have gone out of service, recording an average of a 2.5 years survival rate.

The Express Des Isles sea vessel transported 91.8 per cent of visitors in 1996, maintaining the lead since the start of operations in 1991. However, Express Des Isles performance for the year have not been up to par recording a 0.28 per cent decline when compared to the 56.0 per cent increase in 1993 and 23.0 per cent in 1994 and 1995.

From 1986 to 1988, the Caricom region and Europe were the leading markets in visitor arrivals. From 1990, the French West Indies continually recorded the highest number of visitors while Europe retained its position in second place. The United States market has been the only one recording steady increases in arrivals since 1989 in comparison to the fluctuations in the other major markets (Table 4). Over the ten year period (1986 - 1996) the growth in visitor arrivals registered 176.2 per cent. July remains the most popular month for travel (Table 7A).

The United States recorded the highest percentage increase, 24.3 in tourist arrivals for the year (Table 8B). The Caribbean registered a 3.6 per cent rise while the European market reflected an 8.10 per cent fall in tourist arrivals. The 4 - 7 day category was the most popular length of stay, a shift from the 1 - 3 day stay over the last two years.

The percentage of tourists in hotel accommodation has been steadily decreasing since 1994, falling from 27.8 per cent in 1993 to 22.1 per cent in 1996 (Table 13A). Guest houses and apartments/cottages have accounted for an average of 13.0 and 5.0 per cent respectively over the same period. Non-nationals account for 86.0 per cent of all tourists. The Caribbean recorded 52.0 per cent (of non-nationals), while European and United States market recorded 28.0 and 21.0 per cent respectively over the last two years. For the same period, the Caribbean market recorded an average of 75.0 per cent of nationals. The United States however, registered 16.0 per cent (of nationals) in comparison to 6.0 per cent from Europe.

Excursionists sharply decreased by 35.6 per cent over the year. The French West Indies, the major excursionists market registered a 47.0 percent drop. The record high over the last ten years occurred in 1991 when numbers reached 8,898. The current year's number 5389 fell 39.43 per cent below the 1991 period.

Passenger arrivals continue to increase steadily. A 146.8 per cent increase was recorded over the last ten years (1986 - 1996) with air arrivals currently accounting for about 71.0 per cent of all passengers. Aircraft movements have increased by 71.6 per cent over that period.

The first quarters remain the most popular period for cruise calls. Total cruise calls and passengers increased by 3.6 and 43.4 per cent respectively over the year.




**VISITOR ARRIVALS BY COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE : 1992 – 1996**


**VISITOR ARRIVALS BY COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE : 1992 – 1996**


**PERCENTAGE OF TOURIST ARRIVALS BY PLACE OF STAY : 1992 – 1996**


**PERCENTAGE OF TOURIST ARRIVALS BY ALL PAID ACCOMODATIONS AND PRIVATE HOMES


**NUMBER OF EXCURSIONISTS BY COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE : 1992 – 1996**


PASSENGER ARRIVALS BY CRUISESHIP (EXCLUDING WINDJAMMERS)


**CRUISESHIP CALLS (EXCLUDING WINDJAMMERS)**


**PASSENGER ARRIVALS BY CRUISESHIP (INCLUDING WINDJAMMERS)**
