







## **INTRODUCTION**

The **2003 Travel Report** covers information on travel in and out of Dominica for the last ten years. This report presents data on visitor port of entry, airline and sea vessel activities, country of residence, length and place of stay, purpose of visit and cruise arrivals. The aim of this **annual** report is to assist interested persons, establishments, firms or institutions in readily recognizing visitor/tourist trends in Dominica. This report will help identify chief, potential and untapped markets and also provide information on the flow, activity and market share of main aircraft and sea vessels.

Periodically, relevant information will be added and slight changes will be made in the contents of these reports. Therefore, all suggestions from users that can assist us in improving future issues will be welcomed.

The Central Statistical Office is grateful for the co-operation it has received from the Immigration Department, the Canefield and Melville Hall Airports, the Division of Tourism and the various cruise and airline agencies.

  
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## **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

### **THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS HAVE BEEN USED IN THIS REPORT**

#### **TOURISM:**

Tourism denotes the temporary, short movements of people to destinations outside the places where they normally live and work, for other than business or vocational reasons and their activities during the stay at these destinations.

Tourism represents various types of short-term travel and visits and is variously defined for particular purposes, by reference to the purpose of the journey, its duration and other criteria.

#### **VISITORS:**

A visitor is a non-resident person (national or alien) usually resident abroad, who enters Dominica and intends to stay for not more than one year for non-immigrant purposes such as touring, recreation, leisure, business, study or family reasons. Visitors have been divided into the following categories:

- (i) TOURIST: Any person who stays at least one night but not more than 365 nights in land accommodations.
- (ii) EXCURSIONIST: Any person who does not stay for any one night in any land accommodations.

Hence, an excursionist may either be a flight passenger who departs from Dominica on the same day he arrives, or a boat passenger who sleeps on board the vessel in a port of Dominica.

#### **RESIDENT:**

Any person (national or alien) who has been residing or has been given permission to reside for more than one year and who has not yet been abroad for more than one year.

**TOURISTS ARE SUB-DIVIDED AS FOLLOWS:**

1. Holiday visitors whose purpose of visit is expressly stated as vacation. These visitors are classified either as staying in hotels, guesthouses or cottages, or as staying in private homes (i.e. with friends or relatives).
2. Business visitors who come for private as well as governmental business purposes. Included also are research workers from international institutions such the U.N., the I.M.F. and the CARICOM Secretariat.
3. Students who are permitted to enter to pursue a course of study at a school or university.
4. Other visitors, that is, visitors not covered by the previous three categories.

**THE COUNTRY GROUPINGS USED IN THE TABLES ARE DEFINED AS FOLLOWS:**

**O.E.C.S.:** Antigua, Dominica, Grenada, Montserrat, St. Kitts/Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent

**OTHER CARICOM:** Barbados, Belize, Guyana, Jamaica and Trinidad & Tobago

**FRENCH WEST INDIES:** Martinique, Guadeloupe, The Saints, St. Martin and St. Bartholomew

**SCANDINAVIA:** Norway, Sweden, Denmark with dependencies, Finland and Iceland

## **TRAVEL REVIEW 2003**

In 2003, visitors arriving in Dominica numbered 77,118 recording a growth of 8.8 percent. Tourist and excursionist registered percentage increases of 5.8 and 134.6 percent respectively. A 29.4 percent rise was recorded in cruise ship passengers while the number of cruise ships visiting the Nature Isle grew from 187 to 206 recording a 10.2 percent increase.

The increase in visitors (excluding cruise) came primarily from the Caribbean (13.2 %) and Europe (6.9 %). French West Indies visitors recorded an increase of 16.4 percent over 2002 with Other Caribbean registering a rise of 32.2 percent accounting for the influx of visitors from Haiti and Dominican Republic. For Europe, Scandinavia, Germany and France recorded increases of over 10.0 percent (Table 1A). Customarily, the month of July and September recorded the highest and lowest arrivals. In 2002, an exception was recorded where the month of August recorded the highest arrivals (Table 7).


Air arrivals increased by 4.9 percent over 2002 while arrivals by sea increased by 17.7 percent. The 17.7 percent increase in sea arrivals was due primarily to a significant number of day tours arriving at the Portsmouth Port. (Tables 2 and 3) The number of visitors using Caribbean Star as their means of getting to the island increased from 11,879 in 2002 to 14,747 in 2003. Over a hundred percent increase was recorded in visitors arriving via chartered flights over 2002. This mode of transportation was attributed to the steady flow of arrivals from Haiti and Dominican Republic. On the other hand, visitors arriving via LIAT and American Eagle declined slightly over 2002. Caribbean Ferries recorded a gain in market share in sea visitors transporting 7,558 visitors from a low of 2,320 visitors in 2002. Express Des Iles, on the other hand, registered a steady decline (since 1999) in sea visitors transporting 61.6 percent down from a high of 97.5 percent in 2001 (Table 3).

Tourist arrivals numbered 73,190, an increased of about four thousand over 2002. Two of the main markets, Caribbean and Europe recorded 8.1 and 6.3 percent increases respectively. Percentage increases of 4.5 and 32.4 percents were recorded for French West Indies and Other Caribbean respectively. Other Caribbean includes countries such as Haiti and Dominican Republic and reflects the steady flow of arrivals from these countries. Tourists from Scandinavia, Germany and Switzerland registered increases of 18.9, 11.7 and 11.5 percent respectively (Table 8B).

Tourists from Canada, Europe and United States stay on average at least 12 -13 days in comparison to the 9.7 days which is the intended average length of stay. On average, Caribbean tourist's length of stay is 7.8 days (Table 9A). However, the 4 – 7 day stay remained the most frequent intended length of stay (Table 10). Eighty-two percent of the tourist's primary purpose of visit was holiday while those studying increased to 6.3 percent (Table 12A). Tourist staying in private homes accounted for 63.1 percent followed by those in hotels, 18.5 percent (Table 13A). Nationals residing abroad comprised 11.0 percent of tourists with nationals residing in the French West Indies accounting for 44.5 percent. The United States, French West Indies, Commonwealth Caribbean and Europe accounted for 22.5, 21.7, 21.1 and 15.8 percent (respectively) of non-nationals (Table 15).

In 2003, excursionists numbered 3928 from 1674 in 2002. This was due to an increase in organized day tours from the French West Indies which accounted for a 179.8 % rise in arrivals over the period. Excursionists from France and Scandinavia increased by 116.4 and 33.3 percent respectively over 2002 (Table 19A).

Cruise arrivals in 2003 increased from 136,859 to 177,044 registering a growth of 29.4 percent while cruise ships calls rose by 10.2 percent. The month of December recorded the highest number of cruise ship visits and passengers in contrast to 2002 where the month of January recorded that trend (Table 24A).

VISITOR ARRIVALS BY COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE: 2003







1999 - 2003**







1999 - 2003





### TOURIST ARRIVALS BY AGE GROUP 2003





**NUMBER OF EXCURSIONISTS: 1995 - 2003**




