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PREFACE

This demographic report is the fifth published by the Central Statistical Office. The issue covers information from 1990 to 2006, presents data for the last century and final data for the 2001 Population and Housing Census. Slight revisions have been made to the 2001 Population and Housing Census data.

The report provides data on vital events – births, deaths, marriages and divorces – on fertility, disability, mortality, migration and household composition. It is intended to assist policy makers, planners, administrators, researchers, students and others interested in demographic trends related to Dominica.

The Central Statistical Office appreciates the cooperation of the Ministry of Health Statistical Unit, the Immigration Department, the Registry and its other sources in the collection of data. All suggestions from users and readers which can help us improve on future issues will be welcomed.

ANALYSIS

A Brief Description

The island of the Commonwealth of Dominica is presently 751 square kilometers (298 square miles) and is situated between Latitude 15 40 North and Longitude 61 30 West. The island is in the Eastern Caribbean and is located between the French islands of Guadeloupe and Martinique. Dominica attained political independence from England in 1978. The official language is English. However, because of past French influence, a semi-French dialect (Creole) is widely spoken.

The topography is mountainous and the many rivers flowing from those peaks provide an ample supply of fresh water. The island is relatively quiet and popularly considered the appropriate hide-away from the hustle-bustle of life. The island is currently promoted and is in its developing stage as an eco-tourist destination. The political climate is based on a multi-party democracy.

Economically, a free-market is encouraged. For the 2003 to 2006 period the economy maintained stable growth with an average 3.5 percent. The Tourism and Construction Sectors contributed significantly to this growth accounting for percentage increases of 15.0 and 10.5. For 2007 the Annual Consumer Price Index rose by 3.23 percent, compared to 2.61 percent in 2006. Percentage increases were recorded in group indices Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco 6.69, Fuel and Light, 5.36; Food 5.34 and Medical and Health Expenses 4.16.

Visitor arrivals increased by 24% from 1996 to 2006, reaching a total arrival of 84,967 in 2006. The three major markets are the Caribbean accounting for 55.7 percent, United States of America 26.0 and Europe, 13.4. Cruise lines call in regularly during the peak season with a total number of 314 calls, registering 379,643 passengers in 2006.

THE POPULATION OF DOMINICA

Dominica consists of ten parishes (see map on page v) which are conveniently used for demographic and other analytical purposes. The capital city, Roseau, is located within the parish of St. George in the south-west.

Over the century (1901 – 2001) the population of Dominica moved from 26,841 in 1901 to 69,775 reflecting a 160.0 percent increase. The highest growth rate in any ten year period occurred between 1901 to 1911 (Table 6). After 1970, the rate of growth seemed to have slowed down. In fact, a negative annual growth of 0.4% was recorded for the period 1981-1991. According to the results of the 2001 Census, the population seemed to have dipped again, recording a negative average annual growth of 0.21%.

Over the last century (1901-2001) the parish of St. George, which includes the city of Roseau, has been the most populated region throughout that period. In 1901, St. Patrick, St. Andrew, St. Joseph and St. John also recorded high population concentration. However, in the 2001 Census the order was St. Andrew, St. Patrick, St. Paul, St. David and St. Joseph (Table 1).

2001 CENSUS

The total population of Dominica as of May 12, 2001 numbered 69,775 recording a decrease of 1408 over the 1991 Census. In comparison to the 1991 Population Census only three (3) parishes seemed to have gained population; St. Paul with the largest

increase, 940; St. John gained 332 and St. Luke, 17. All other parishes reflected population loss, the largest in St. Andrew with a loss of 858; St. George recorded a loss of 502; St. Patrick followed with a net loss of 478; St. Joseph registered a loss of 413; St. Mark 34 persons; St. Peter 195, and St. David 219.

The population distribution by parish or population zone indicates that the Parish of St. George (which includes the city of Roseau) records 28%, St. Andrew 15%, St. Patrick and St. Paul 12% each, St. David 10% and St. Joseph and St. John 8%. The largest population areas are Roseau with 14,579 persons, Portsmouth with 4012, Canefield 2,803; Marigot 2,676; Grand Bay – Berricoa, 2,288; Salisbury 2,129; Mahaut 2,399; St. Joseph 2,029; Wesley 1756, Carib Territory, 1653 and Pointe Michel, 1576. Other areas which have already reached 1000 and more persons are as follows:

Massacre, La Plaine, Castle Bruce, Atkinson, Calibishie, Soufriere and Woodford Hill.

AGE STRUCTURE

The age structure of the population in 2001 revealed that the 20-59 age group accounted for the highest percentage of the population, 47.6 percent. The 0-19 followed recording 39.0 percent. However in comparison to 1991 the 0-19 age group recorded the highest percentage, 45.2 percent; the 20-59 age group followed closely, accounting for 43.3 percent. The 60 and over age-group increased steadily from 8.5 percent of the population in 1970 to 13.4 percent in 2001. The sex ratio in 1991 revealed a 993.3 indicating a population with a higher frequency of females than males (993 men to every 1000 females). However the trend took an opposite turn in the 2001 Census when results reflected a sex ratio of 1012.7 (1013 males to every 1000 females).

For both census periods, 1991 and 2001, males recorded a higher percent in age groups 0-19 and 20-59. In 1991 the male population in the 0-19 age group represented 23.0 percent while females registered 22.2 percent. In 2001 males recorded 19.7 percent while females accounted for 19.3 percent.

In 1991 males in the 20-59 age group registered 21.5 percent while females accounted for 21.1 percent. Similarly, in 2001, the male population in the 20-59 group recorded 24.7 percent while females represented 22.8 percent. In the 60 and over age group, females accounted for a higher percentage of the population.

In 1991, the female population in the 60 and over age-group represented 6.5% in comparison to 5.0 percent of males. In the 2001 Census the female population in the 60 and over age-group recorded 7.5 percent in comparison to 5.9 percent of males.

POPULATION DENSITY

Population density decreased slightly by 2.1 percent from 95 to 93 persons per square kilometer. St. George which comprises the city of Roseau registered the highest density with 353 persons per square kilometer (Table 7). Other zones of relatively high density are St. Luke with 146; St. Mark, 144 persons; and St. Paul with 127 persons. The lowest density is registered in the parish of St. Peter with 43 persons per square kilometer.

St. Paul registered the highest percentage increase in density, 12.4. Other increases were recorded for St. John 7.1 and St. Luke 1.4. All other areas declined in density with St. Peter registering the largest percentage, decrease, 10.4 percent. The population zone of St. Andrew followed with an 8.1 percent drop.

BIRTH PATTERNS AND FERTILITY RATES

Total births decline by 56.9% over the census years 1960 and 2001 (Table 2). From 1992 to 2006 total births reflected a steady decline (except for the years 1999, 2001, 2004 and 2006) registering a 42.4% decrease over that period (Table 8).

Over the seventeen year period (1990-2006) births peaked in 1992 (1836 births) registering a birth rate of 25.6, the highest for the period, while the year 2005 registered the lowest number ever recorded (1009 births). Consequently the birth rate reflected its lowest 14.3 in 2005 (Table 12). The decreasing birth rate (from 1993) has been one of the contributory demographic processes to the slow down in the rate of natural increase.

From 1996 to 2001, the 25-29 age group registered the highest number of births, as this group accounted for 23.0 to 28.0 percent of total births each year. From 2002 to 2004 an older age group, the 30-34 registered the highest number of births. Interestingly, in the last two years, 2005, 2006 the 20-24 age group emerged as the age group recording the highest number of births.

Over the last three decades the reproductive patterns were as follows: the 15-19 age group recorded the highest births up to 1984; (Demographic Statistics, No. 1) from 1985 to 1995, the 20-24 age group obtained that position (Demographic Statistics No. 2) and from 1996 to 2001 an older age-group, 25-29 recorded the highest number of births (Table 15). From 2002 to 2004 an even older age-group 30-34 attained this position and from 2005 to 2006, the 20-24 age group seem to regain the highest birth levels since 1995. These demographic processes have resulted in a steady increase in the mean age of childbearing from 26.5 years in 1981 to 28.9 in 2001(Table 15A).

Together these two groups, 20-24 and 25-29 accounted for 40% to 52% of all births. Births to teen mothers decreased sharply by 30.7 percent over the last ten years. Conversely, the percentage of births by the oldest child-bearing age-group, 40 to 49 rose by a record 100.0 percent from 32 in 1997 to 64 births in 2006 accounting for 6.0 percent of all births.

Dominica consists of seven health districts. Most health districts, however, serve more than one parish or population zone.

Over the last years, most births (about 42% to 47% of total births) occurred in Roseau Health District, the largest, serving four parishes/population zones. Except for the years 1993 and 1999 the Portsmouth Health District (serving the north) followed as the second most reproductive district (Table 17). It is interesting to note that from 1987 to 1991, the Grand Bay district (serving the south) continually recorded a higher number of female births as compared to male births (Table 19, Demographic Statistics No. 2/1996). However a reverse trend was recognized from 1992 to 1999 (except for a slight difference in 1995). From 2000 to 2004 female births again outnumbered male births in that district.

FERTILITY PATTERNS

For the 1981, 1991, and 2001 censuses the age specific fertility rates revealed shifts in Dominica's fertility pattern (Table 15A). The total fertility rate recorded a drop, over the 1981 and 1991 period, moving from 4.2 in 1981 to 3.0 in 1991 but indicated a stable pattern of 3.0 up to 2001. Accordingly in 1981, the 20-24 age-group was the most reproductive but in the 1991 census this reproductive position as revealed by the age-specific rate, shifted to an older age-group, the 25 to 29. In 2001 this age-group, 25-29,

retained its position as the most reproductive. Over the last three census periods, decreases in fertility rates were registered in all age-group except the 40-44, the oldest reproductive group. However over the last two census periods 1991 and 2001 the 35-39 age group recorded an increased rate.

The decline in teenage fertility closely corresponds to the steady decline in births to teenage mothers. From 1980 to 1990, the years before the censuses, teenage pregnancies decreased by 27.8 percent (Table 16 and Demographic Statistics No. 1. 1993) while in a more recent period, in year 2000, a 35.6 percent decline in births was recorded over 1990. The stagnation in the present total fertility rate and the decline from the 1981 level is mainly attributed to downward movements in the number of births coupled with the effects of migration. According to the 1991 and 1981 Census, in spite of a 4.5 percent increase in the number of women within the child-bearing age, their age specific fertility rate over the period moved from 158.3 to 108.2, as lower births were recorded within that period.

The mean age at child-bearing increased from 26.5 to 27.2 years for that period (1981 to 1991). In 2001 the trend continued as the child-bearing population increased by 12.8 percent. Births however fell, reflecting a 10.2 percent decrease over the last census period. This drop in births reduced the age specific fertility rate to 86.1 in 2001.

DEATHS

Over the census years 1960 to 2001 total deaths decreased by 44.6 percent (Table 2). For the last ten years (1997 to 2006) the highest number of deaths occurred in 1999,

recording a total of 618 deaths. In 2006, deaths among the senior population (those 65 and over) registered 72.2 percent while this age group recorded 67.9 percent of all deaths in 2005. Most deaths occurred in the 85 and over age-group, registering 28.4 percent of all deaths (Table 21A).

Throughout the period, 2001 to 2006, 33.3 to 35.2 percent of deaths resulted from diseases of the circulatory system which according to International Classification of Diseases (ICD) 10 includes hypertensive, heart and cerebrovascular diseases. Neoplasms followed, recording 16.5 to 23.9 percent of all deaths. In 2006 the major causes of death (in sub-categories) were heart disease recording 12.9 percent and cerebrovascular diseases registering 11.8 percent of all deaths. Diabetes followed with a total of 43 deaths or 8.0 percent.

Infant deaths registered a total of 13 in 2006, decreasing by 40.9 percent over the last year. A record low of 12 infant death was recorded in 2002, (Tables 12 and 21). Children deaths registered 33.5 percent decline in 2006 with four deaths, recording the second lowest number, a record low of only 2 deaths was registered in year 2000.

MIGRATION

According to the results of the 2001 census taken on 12 May 2001, the non-institutional population of Dominica numbered 69,775. Over the last five census years (Table 2) the 1960 period recorded the highest number of emigrants, while 1981 registered an inflow. The common destination at that period (1960) was the United Kingdom, England in particular. The exodus waned throughout the years until the early 1980's. This movement was however changed in 1983, when a record mass exodus, 2392, exceeded

that of 1960 (Table 2 and Demographic Statistics, No. 1, 1993). From 1983 to 1989 out-migration appeared to be an uncontrolled "force", negatively affecting the total increase, and consequently the end of year population. The outflow had its greatest impact in 1989 (recording an outflow of 2355), when total increase reached its lowest (Table 9 Demographic Statistics, No. 2, 1996).

Destinations became varied as Dominicans looked at more favoured economies. Other Caribbean islands and the U.S.A. then become popular choices. The total number of visas issued to Dominicans for entry into the United States accounted for 7.0 percent of the mean population in 1989 (Table 12 and Demographic Statistics, No. 2, 1996).

From 1997 to 2003 the number of entrants to the French territories reached a peak in 2001 accounting for 12.4 percent of the mean population. It must be noted that a significant number of those visas issued included persons involved in the long-established island to island sea-borne trade, locally known as the "huckster" trade. Those traders have accounted for about 45 to 50 percent of entrants to the French territories and are not migrants.

Over the last census periods (1991-2000) the population of Dominica recorded a net outflow of 8,966 persons. From 1996 to 2003 the end of year population decreased steadily. Over the years, net migration continually recorded an outflow, negatively affecting total increase and the end of year population. It has been observed that high levels of migration is triggered after a natural disaster particularly hurricanes. Such phenomena can create counter movements of migration. The after-math of such natural phenomena creates an attractive labor market in countries of the Region as was noticed

after the hurricanes of 1995. Skilled workers migrated in search of employment thus creating a population outflow.

Recently the most popular migrant destination have been other Caribbean countries and the United States. According to preliminary data from the last population census of Antigua and Barbuda, the Dominica population in Antigua and Barbuda numbered 3,911 representing 5.2 percent of Antigua's population and 5.6 percent of the present mean population of Dominica. In the British Virgin Islands (BVI) Census the Dominican population registered 683 representing 3.0 percent of the BVI's population.

From 1993 to 2002 the United States Embassy issued a total of 4,704 immigrant visa granting resident status to Dominicans. This represented 6.7 percent of Dominica's mean population in 2002. The population has been subjected to the forces or processes of out-migration. In addition to the effects of natural disasters, population outflows have been associated with the implementation of medium and long-term policies that may affect a people's socio-economic standing. A recessionary period may also contribute to high outflows.

For a relatively small population, outflow may subside with economic growth, social well-being and absence of severe natural disasters. These factors along with the occurrence of increased birth rates will stimulate population growth. Over the last three years the population outflow has significantly lessened with steady inflows recording a net of 344 persons in 2006.

MARRIAGES AND DIVORCES

Over the last ten years (1997 - 2006) total marriages registered its highest 339, in 1999 (Table 27). Except for the years 2000 and 2002 most brides were from the 25 to 29

age-group, interestingly corresponding with the group with the highest fertility rate.

Except for the years 1994 and 1997 most grooms fell in an older age-group, the 30-34.

From the ages 15 to 29, brides consistently outnumbered grooms but for the ages 30 and over grooms constantly recorded higher numbers in comparison to brides, revealing that most males wed at a later age.

From 2002 to 2006, divorces filed increased significantly by 102.3 percent, recording steady increases for that period.

HOUSEHOLD AND HOUSEHOLD SIZE

The total number of households increased by 12.7 percent from 1991-2001 (the last two census years). Of the ten parishes, St. Paul and St. John registered the highest percentage increases of 33.0 and 32.5. St. Luke and St. Mark followed recording increases of 12.0 and 11.9 percent. St. David registered an 11.4 percent rise. The parish of St. George, which comprises the City and its environs, registered an increase of 9.3 percent in total households, in contrast to a 2.5 percent decline in population. St. Peter recorded the lowest increase, 0.9 percent.

Over the period, all population zones continued to reflect reductions in average household size. The double effects of migration and increases in number of households contributed to that decline. According to the 2001 census, St. Peter and St. Joseph recorded the smallest household size, 2.7 while the largest, 3.5 was registered in St. David, a position 'maintained" over the last three censuses.

SUMMARY

The main and most reliable source of information on population is a census. In this report, total population counts were taken and based on censuses. Since the population of

Dominica is relatively small, the end of year populations were basically derived from the components of total increase (births, deaths and net migration) using the most recent census as base, with the number of vital events after the census date taken into account to adjust the end of year population for 2001. According to the results of the last census (2001) the population numbered 69775 thus reflecting a slight negative growth of 2.0 over the last ten years (1991-2001). It was not a first-time low as negative growth was recorded in 1891 and 1991 (Table 6). The 2006 end of year population is estimated at 71,180 recording a 1.1 percent increase over the 2001 adjusted end of year population.











CHART 4. NON INSTITUTIONAL POPULATION BY SEX AND FIVE YEAR GROUP 2001 CENSUS
