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Foreword

This summary report on International Trade in Services and Investment Statistics presents an overview of the status and availability of services statistics for Dominica. It is the third issue presenting data for 2014 and 2015. According to the United Nations Manual on Statistics of International Trade in Services 2010 (MSITS 2010), the term *international trade in services* covers transactions (imports and exports) of services between residents and non-residents of an economy. It can also be interpreted to cover services delivered through locally established, but foreign controlled enterprises. The latter transactions are generally understood to be *Foreign Affiliates Statistics* (FATS)¹.

Due to the shifting trend of trade following advances in technology, International Trade in Services and Investment Statistics are becoming increasingly important for governments. Guided by the United Nations (MSITS 2010) the statistics to be compiled are the Extended Balance of Payments Statistics (EBOPS), FATS variables, Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) Flows and Stocks and trade in services statistics through the *General Agreement of Trade in Services* (GATS) modes of supply.

EBOPS presents the various services activities important to an economy and their foreign exchange use and contribution.

FATS variables allow for a comprehensive analysis of the contribution of branches of international companies operating locally and vice versa. Importantly, it provides indicators on employment, and allows for comparisons with domestically owned companies.

FDI flows allows for analysis of trends in income and capital flows of FDIs in the local economy.

GATS modes of supply present the different modes of trading in international services and are particularly needed by negotiators in the Ministry of Trade.

¹ The acronym FATS has been changed from *Foreign Affiliates Trade in Services* to the more general *Foreign Affiliates Statistics*. For historical consistency FATS has been maintained.

The Central Statistics Office compiles mainly EBOPS, with available information for FATS compilation. In addition, the Caribbean Single Market and Economy (CSME) Core Indicators on Trade in Goods, Trade in Services, Movement of Capital, Labor Market, Macroeconomic and Finance Stability, Climate Change and Key Sectors are presented for the first time in this Report.

Future reports will present additional information on Exports and Imports of Services by country of origin. This has been facilitated through a Caribbean Community (CARICOM) consultancy project on Trade in Services with support from the European Union.

Introduction

Compilation continues to be based on recommendations in the Draft Manual on Statistics of International Trade in Services, 2010 (MSITS 2010) and includes approaches for data capture for new line items in the Extended Balance of Payments Services (EBOPS) and revision of existing data to the MISITS 2010. Wider industry coverage continues to be undertaken and where necessary revised methodologies for estimation are applied. Sector data review was performed for Manufacturing services on physical inputs owned by others, Maintenance and repair services n.i.e, Transportation to include Postal and Courier services, Travel, Construction, Insurance Services, Financial Services, Charges for Use of Intellectual Property, Telecommunications, Computer and Information services (Combined), Other Business Services (Research and Development Services, Professional and Management Consulting Services), Personal, Cultural and Recreational Services and Government services, n.i.e.

The statistics presented in this report indicates trend in Dominica's services trade by categories and should prove useful to policy makers, researchers, investors, academics and other data users. Suggestions for improvement, comments or queries may be directed to the Central Statistics Office, Ministry of Finance.

TRADE IN SERVICES STATISTICS (TISS) 2014 - REVIEW

Total services receipts from abroad registered EC\$470.58M an increase of 30.01 percent from EC\$361.96M recorded in 2013. Total services payments overseas increased significantly by 65.13 percent, moving from EC\$178.98M to EC\$295.54M. The main contributor to this sharp rise in transaction was Other Business Services which comprises legal, accounting, marketing, advertising, professional and management consulting activities. Net services receipts registered EC\$175.04M, recording a 4.34 percent decline (Table 1.0).

Transportation receipts from overseas recorded EC\$19.30M compared to EC\$18.63M in 2013, increasing by 3.60 percent, while expenses on foreign transportation increased by 14.51 percent moving from EC\$81.07M to EC\$92.83M. This resulted in a 17.77 percent increase in net transportation expenses in 2014.

Travel Receipts continue to be the largest contributor, accounting for 72.97 percent of total receipts from services. For the period under review this category increased significantly by 55.16 percent registering EC\$343.39M, up from EC\$221.32M in 2013. Travel overseas expenditure increased by 30.69 percent. Net receipts from travel recorded EC\$301.19M, a sharp increase of 59.33 percent over the last year.

Receipts from insurance services registered EC\$23.85M increasing 49.44 percent over the last year. However, expenditure on Insurance abroad declined 3.98 percent, moving from EC\$17.75M in 2013 to EC\$17.04M in 2014.

Foreign receipts for the use of telecommunications, computer and information services recorded a 1.07 percent decline while expenses on such services abroad recorded a 48.23 percent increase. Consequently, net receipts for this category decreased moving from EC\$34.50M in 2013 to EC\$29.89M in 2014, registering a 13.37 percent drop.

Earnings from other business services increased by 6.36 percent. However expenditure significantly increased by 376.53 percent leading to an overall 571.06 percent of net transactions.

Receipts for Government services registered EC\$32.14 M falling sharply by 40.74 percent while expenses followed a similar trend decreasing by 17.83 percent. Net receipts thereby moved from EC\$ 48.65M to EC\$27.56M recording a sharp 43.37 percent drop.

TRADE IN SERVICES STATISTICS (TISS) 2015 - REVIEW

For 2015 total services receipts from abroad registered EC\$551.12M an increase of 17.11 percent from EC\$470.58M recorded in 2014. In spite of a 2.73 percent increase in total services payments,(moving from EC\$295.54M to EC\$303.60M) net services receipts recorded a sharp 41.40 percent rise moving from EC\$175.04M to EC\$247.51M (Table 2.0).This sharp increase resulted from increased activity in Government services sector.

Transportation receipts from overseas recorded EC\$28.34M compared to EC\$19.30M in 2014, increasing by 46.86 percent, while payments for such services increased by 0.02 percent moving from EC\$92.83M to EC\$92.85M. This resulted in a 12.27 percent decline, a narrowing of the deficit in net transportation transactions in 2015.

Travel receipts continue to be the largest contributor, accounting for 61.26 percent of total receipts from services. However travel receipts slightly decreased by 1.68 percent over the last year moving from EC\$343.39M to EC\$337.60M in 2014. On the other hand, Travel overseas expenditure increase 13.35 percent over the period moving from EC\$42.19M to EC\$47.83M. Net receipts from travel therefore recorded EC\$289.77M, a decrease of 3.79 percent over the last year.

Receipts from Insurance Services recorded EC\$15.69M decreasing sharply by 34.19 percent. However, expenditure on Insurance abroad increased by 25.90 percent moving from EC\$17.04M in 2014 to EC\$21.46M in 2015.

Receipts for the use of Telecommunications, Computer and Information Services registered EC\$30.46M, recording a 28.58 percent drop while expenses on those services abroad recorded a similar trend decreasing 8.76 percent to EC\$11.65M. Consequently, net receipts for this category decreased moving from EC\$29.89M in 2014 to EC\$18.81M in 2015, registering a 37.05 percent decline.

Revenue from Other Business Services increased by 2.18 percent while expenditure increased by a slight 1.97 percent leading to an overall 1.96 percent rise in deficit of net transactions.

Receipts for Government services registered exorbitant growth of 303.12 percent, as government services recorded increased activity moving from EC\$32.14M in 2014 to an estimated

EC\$129.56M in 2015. Payments declined by 13.11 percent. Net receipts therefore registered a record 355.79 percent growth moving from EC\$27.55M in 2014 to EC\$125.57M in 2015.

TOTAL SERVICES TRADE SUMMARY 2002-2015

Total services net trade recorded the sharpest growth, 41.40 percent in 2015. The sharp drop of 37.86 percent in 2012 was due mainly to a 25.71 percent decrease in Travel Receipts. Total services net trade recorded an average annual rate of growth of 12.88 percent over the period 2002 to 2015.

Trade in travel related services (*mainly tourism and offshore students*) continue to be the most significant contributor to Dominica's services trade, consistently recording upwards of 61.0 percent of services trade income annually (Table 3.0). However, transportation services (*sea freight and air passenger expenses*) records the highest levels of services expenditure overseas with an average annual expenditure of EC\$45.67M. The lowest payment EC\$30.58M was recorded in 2015 (Table 3.0).

CHART 1.0 NET TRADE BY TYPE OF SERVICE: 2013-2014

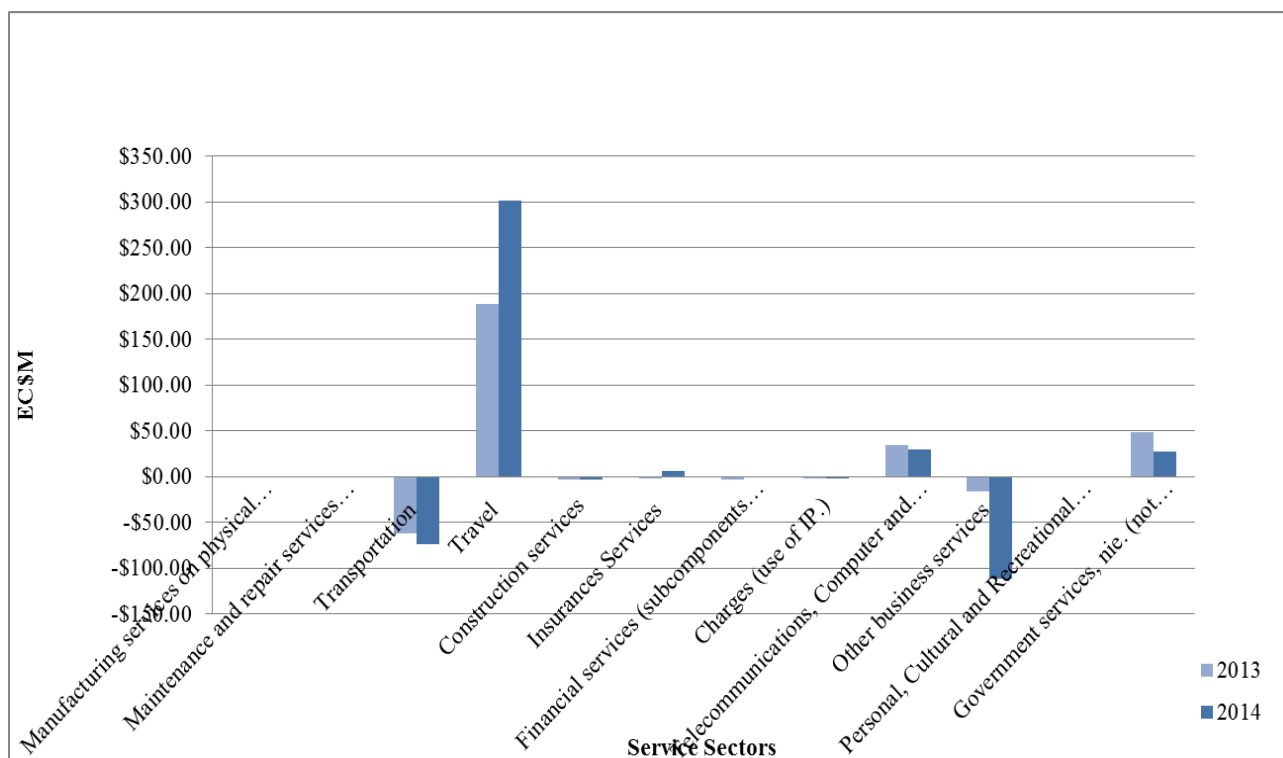


CHART 2.0 NET TRADE BY TYPE OF SERVICE: 2014-2015

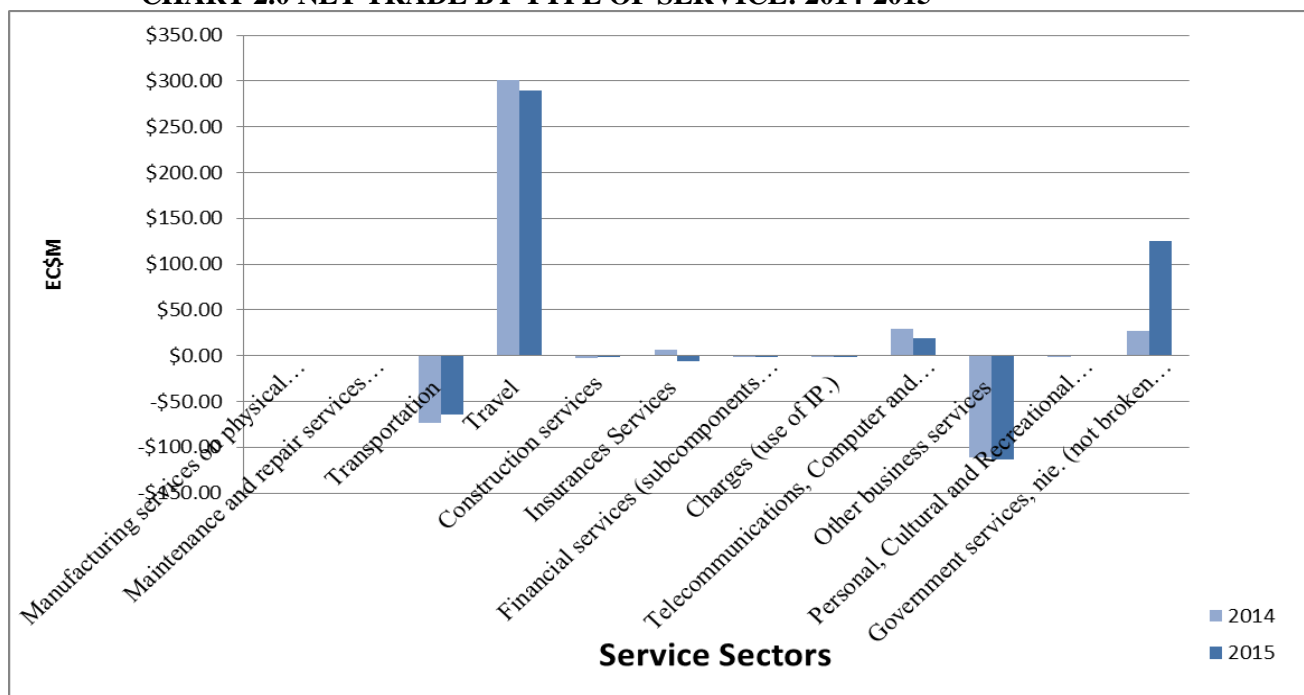


CHART 3.0 TOTAL SERVICES NET TRADE: 2001-2015

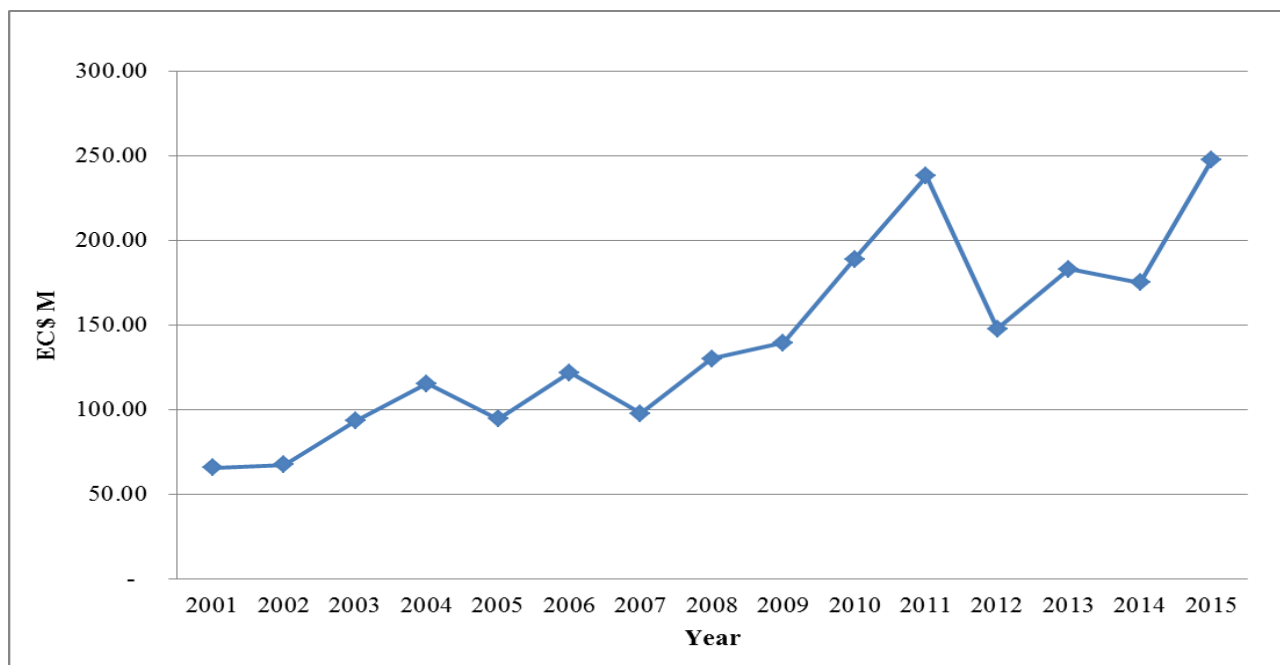
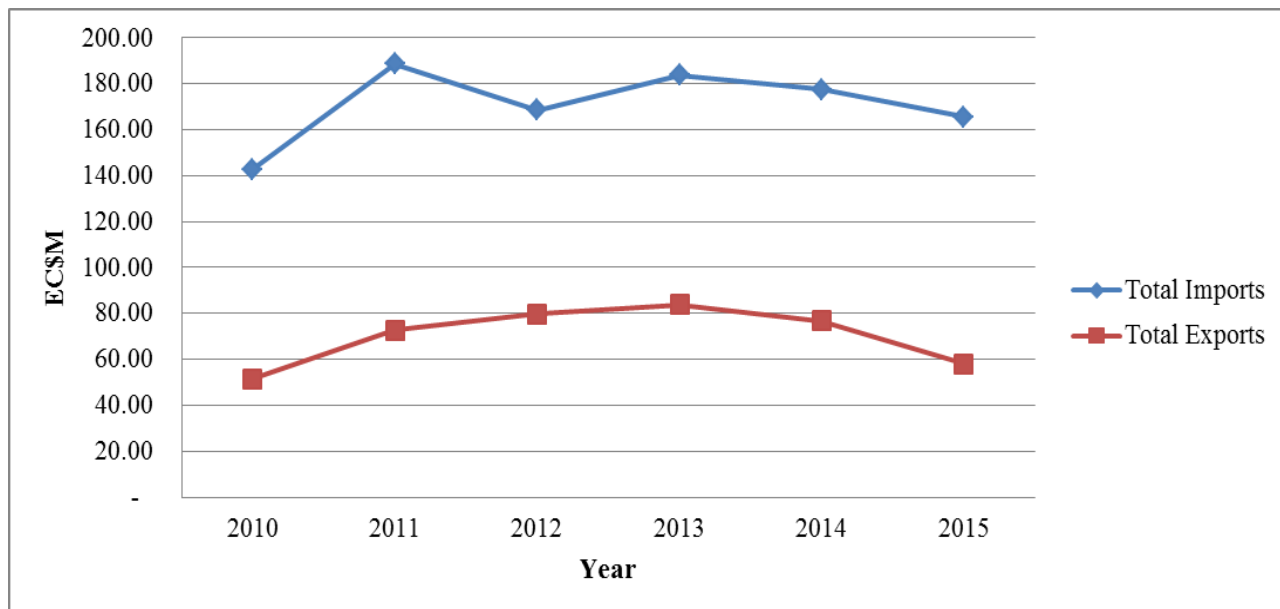
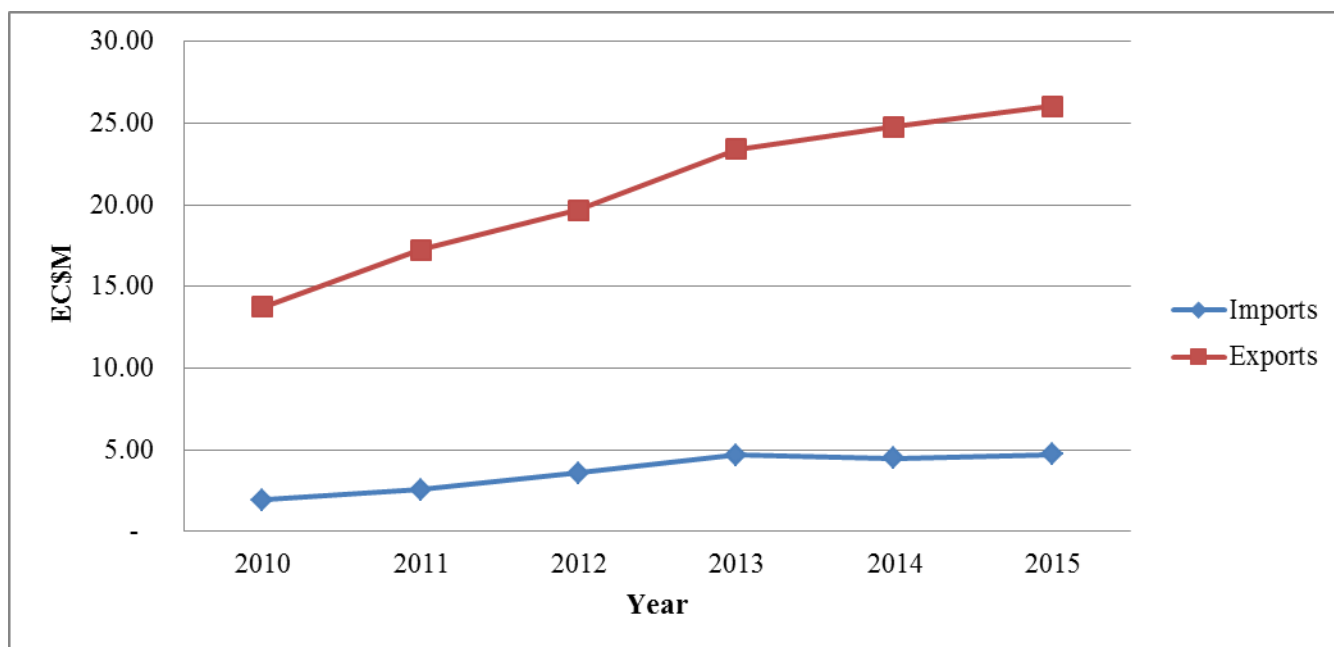


CHART 4.0 TOTAL IMPORTS AND EXPORTS- CARICOM: 2010-2015
